At Monthly Meeting for January on January 9, Business and Finance reported that all budget requests for 2021 have been met and we are beginning

the new year with a surplus. Unfortunately, we have received fewer faith promises and less total contributions pledged for 2022. We approved the 2022 budget with faith that shortfalls will be met. Trustees reported that temporary roof repairs at the parsonage have been working, and we are contacting roofers for permanent repairs. In addition, inspectors have found the kitchen sprinkler system to be out of code and needs replacement, and ADA improvements to restrooms are required as well. We are continuing discussions with tenants and reaching out to groups in need of meeting and gathering space in an effort to share our facilities. Reverend Tsukasa Sugimura contacted the Meeting reaffirming our century-old relationship with the Japanese church, acknowledging that we provided a place when they could not go anywhere else. Training continues in preparation for fully-hybrid Meeting for Worship. We are actively working on updates to our calendaring and communication capability.

Jesus told his disciples “Come away to a deserted place by yourselves and rest a while.” This was after they told him all they had done, and so much was going on they did not even have time to eat. It seems the church was busy then as well.



There are so many things going on in our lives, the world, and our Meeting. We might not see it because there are many different people and different groups doing things. The activities are not public and we aren’t driving or gathering. Some of it is done to us—the stress of headlines, news, emails, phone calls, junk mail, and social media. And, oh yes—the pandemic.

It is also something we feel with emotions vacillating between excitement and disappointment over not being able to be with people we care about because, “Yep, the infection rate is surging again.” We feel it all. It makes us tired. I read an article that said if you are usually a very productive person but are feeling lazy, it isn’t actually laziness. You are tired.

We need to celebrate what we have accomplished following the Spirit, and know that after all we have done, we should be tired. Then we can rest knowing we did what God set before us, and we are not even one little bit lazy.

Russ' Reflections *On missing our singing together*

I recently attended an online conference for church musicians that began with a lecture by Tom Trenney, Minister of Music at First Plymouth United Church of Christ in Lincoln, Nebraska. He is a great thinker and a great musician. These thoughts were provoked by his words.

One of the aspects of our community has been missing since March 13, 2020, when our Covid restrictions began: singing together. When we sing together, we breathe together. At Creation, God gave breath to humans. God gives *us* breath. We give back our breath when we praise God in song, together. Alas, this is one reason we have had to stop singing and worshipping together, because our breaths combine and potentially can spread the Covid virus. This is also a reason that some of us long for the time when we can gather in person again.

God also gave humanity the gift of music. There is music inside *all* of us. It is for each of us to discover how to release the music inside of us. When we are able to sing together in worship, we have an opportunity to return to God our gift of music. It is a way we can actively participate in worship, in the same way Spirit-led vocal ministry can bring the Meeting together. Music unites us. Henry Van Dyke said, "Use the talents you possess; the woods would be very silent if no birds sang there except those that sang best."

When was the last time you read scripture or recited a poem or prayer out loud? Probably not often, but when we sing in worship, we sing prayers, poetry, and words from the Bible. Music helps us remember these words and ideas.

How can you participate in the music remotely from your Zooming devices? When there is a hymn, you can sing along, muted of course, or tap your toe, jingle your keys, or listen attentively and breathe in and along with the music you are hearing. When it is appropriate and possible, we will provide you with the texts that are sung by our musicians. It may be a while before we are able to make music together again in person, but when we do, I hope you will join in.
